## God is Wonderful in His Saints

St Paul of Thebes (January 15th) and St Anthony the Great (Januarly 17th)



St. Anthony the Great is one of the most beloved saints in Orthodox tradition, especially among monks by whom he is considered the father of monasticism. Fewer know of St. Paul of Thebes, who began his ascetic struggles in the Egyptian desert a generation earlier and who was greatly revered by St. Anthony. St. Paul was born in Thebaid around the year 227 AD to wealthy parents. He and his sister were orphaned when they were young and thus received a large inheritance. His sister married and when Paul was in his twenties, his sister's husband, a pagan, tried to extort St. Paul's inheritance by threatening to report that Paul had become a Christian. This was during the time of the persecutions of Christians by the Emperor Decius (249-251). Instead, St. Paul gave his inheritance directly to his sister
