A Diary of a Russian Priest

Neither the man, nor the woman, possesses absolute power over the other partner in the marriage. Coercion exercised over the will of another--even in the name of love--kills love itself. And so the question arises: must one submit to coercion if it threatens that which is most precious? A countless number of unhappy marriages result from precisely this--that each partner considers him or herself as the owner of the loved one. This is the cause of nearly all the difficulties of married life. The highest wisdom in marriage is shown by giving full freedom to the person you love: for our human marriage is the counterpart of the marriage in heaven between Christ and the Church, where there is absolute freedom.

Man enters deeply into the texture of the world through his family alone.
